Introduction

1.1 Manchester City Council's Cash grant programme was set up in 1999, initially as a one – off scheme to support community projects that contributed to the objectives of the Bright and Clean campaign or the Crime and Disorder Reduction Strategy. Following the popularity and success of the scheme, the City Council agreed to continue providing support for this programme with the budget per ward rising from an initial £25,000 to £45,000 in 2010. Since this funding scheme was first launched, the Council has made an investment of approximately £8 million in 32 wards in Manchester. This is in addition to statutory provision of services.

2. Background

- 2.1 The present Cash grants scheme together with Proud of Manchester campaign aims to help local people and community groups develop projects that can make a real difference to their lives and neighbourhoods. The programme encourages residents to identify problems and find solutions that will improve their environment and quality of life. Cash grants have enabled residents deliver a range of excellent innovative projects many of which have made a real difference to the way people feel about their area. The Cash grant programme is built on the principle of self-help, with project ideas initiated, planned and implemented by the residents and community groups.
- 2.2 In the past City Council departments have delivered a number of big operational/environmental Cash projects on behalf of applicants. However, due to the implications of VAT for the Council, it is no longer possible to process payments in this way. This had some positive effects on the programme by enabling local people to become more involved in the design and delivery of the project and empowering them to take action and acquire new skills.

3. Administration and Management

- 3.1 Cash grants are awarded to local groups on a yearly basis through a competitive application process with no deadline. Each ward is given a total budget, which in 2010 was £45,000, to support schemes, which are of wide community benefit and in line with the local ward plans and priorities. The administration of the programme is supported by a database, which allows Ward Support Officers to record new applications, check the progress of payments and generate standard forms and letters to applicant groups. The Area Co-ordination and Third Sector Team continues to be the designated budget holder for the Cash grants programme and are responsible for its overall financial management, marketing and post-programme evaluation.
- 3.2 The delegated authority for the management of this programme has been given to Ward Co-ordinators who, after the consultation with Ward councillors, makes final decision on funding applications in each ward. The devolution of the administration of the programme to the local/grass root level offers elected Members and Ward Co-ordinators an opportunity to determine which projects

deal most effectively with local priorities and have most desirable effect in the wards. Administration of the scheme is simple, flexible and responsive to residents' needs. The application form is straightforward and accessible to people not used to applying for and/or completing applications. To ensure that the process is consistent we have recently introduced additional page for Area Co-ordination officers to help them ensure that the project meets a standard (baseline) eligibly criteria.

- 3.3 For projects to be considered they must:-
 - benefit Manchester residents,
 - involve local people in development and delivery of the project and
 - represent value for money

Like any funding programme, Cash receives a number of speculative bids from individuals and businesses and it is possible that additional criteria will have to be implemented to prevent such bids especially at a time when other grant streams are diminishing. The decision-making criteria of the Cash grant programme continues to prioritise applications from small and local groups whose work has potential to improve the area and quality of life of its residents.

3.4 The Cash grants programme has evolved to be responsive to the changing needs and priorities of the Council as well as Manchester residents. As such, over the last three years, the programme has been successfully championing the innovative approach to community engagement through the participatory budgeting events: "U Decide", in a number of wards.

4. "U Decide" events or Participatory Budgeting (PB)

4.1 Participatory budgeting is a way of involving communities in real decisions on spending priorities for a specific public budget. Elected members, Ward Coordinators and Support Officers can use it to engage residents and community groups to discuss and vote on spending priorities. It is a powerful tool for engaging with residents and can be used to involve and encourage a broader spread of people. Research has shown that PB directly benefits individuals by forming strong links to a neighbourhood and building a capital of new skills and experiences. At the same time, if offers ward Members and the Ward Coordination Team an opportunity to effectively reconnect people, often disenfranchised, with democratic process and build trust.

The Cash grant programme is an effective tool in championing community engagement at the grass root/neighbourhood level. The process of awarding grants is determined in consultation with ward members who have essential understanding of problems and demographics of individual wards. The cash scheme promotes the idea of partnership working, negotiating solutions to the local problems and improving participatory democracy. Over the years, the Ward Co-ordination and ward Members have been involved in advising and consulting on numerous community projects often with marginalised and hard to reach communities. The Cash grant programme is an initial broker of those

relationships. It supports the community action and has a mandate to bring together different ideas and encourage open dialogue with new and diverse residents groups.

4.2 The "U Decide" event is a unique brand for participatory budgeting developed and piloted through the Cash grants programme in four wards in Manchester. The events inspired large turnouts of residents who felt that their actions would make a tangible difference to their local neighbourhoods and communities. The next section discusses these outcomes in detail.

5. PB Pilots using Cash Grants

5.1 Two PB events took place in Fallowfield and Whalley Range wards in 2008/9 under the name of "U Decide". Following the success of these events in 2009/10, four U Decide pilots took place across Chorlton, Fallowfield, Whalley Range and Northenden. The first three events were funded by CASH and the Northenden event was funded by central government funding to develop engagement in Northenden. The following case studies provide a snapshot of "U Decide" events and its successes:

CASE STUDY - CHORLTON

In Chorlton, £10,000 was allocated from Chorlton Wards Cash Grant budget to hold a "U Decide" event for residents in Chorlton in October 2009. The maximum amount accepted for each bid was £1,000. 16 project bids were submitted to the value of £13,966.85, and accepted in line with the funding criteria. A total of 141 people attended the "U Decide" event and 102 people were eligible to vote. Of the 16 project bids submitted, 12 projects were funded which had been voted on by local residents.

CASE STUDY - FALLOWFIELD

In February 2010, Fallowfield ward allocated £10,000 to hold a "U Decide" event for its residents. The maximum amount accepted for each bid was £1,500. 11 projects were submitted to the value of £14,350 and accepted in line with the funding criteria. A total of 46 people attended the event with 34 of them actually voting. Of the 11 proposed bids, eight were successful in securing funding. The funded bids ranged from young to older people's projects both working for the benefit of the community they live in.

CASE STUDY – WHALLEY RANGE

Whalley Range allocated £12,000 to carry out a "U Decide" event in March 2010. The maximum amount accepted for each bid was £1,000. 17 project bids were submitted to the value of £14,965, and accepted in line with the funding criteria. A total of 102 people attended the event and 84 people voted. Of the 17 project submitted, 14 were funded to the value of £12,265. The successful projects were all about being resourceful and imaginative in our approaches to local issues such as

eating (Eat your Street project), cycling (Bike Resurrection) and helping the youngest to enjoy local facilities.

CASE STUDY – NORTHENDEN

In January 2010, Northenden Ward secured £50,000 from central government to increase community engagement activity in the ward and empower local residents. £15,000 of this was allocated to a "U Decide Event which took place in March 2010. The maximum amount accepted for each bid was £2,000.

In Northenden the "U Decide" event was part of an ongoing dialogue with residents, 12 Project bids were submitted to the value of £20,383, and accepted in line with the funding criteria. A total of 90 people attended the event and 71 people voted. Of the 12 project bids submitted, nine projects were funded.

- 5.2 The "U Decide" pilots were successful in making people feel that they can influence decisions and get satisfaction from the local area. Across the four pilots, 78% of respondents felt that that they were able to influence decisions by attending the events whilst 87% of people felt that the projects they voted for would help improve their local neighbourhoods.
- 5.3 379 people attended the events and 289 people took part in voting for projects that they thought would most improve their local area. The total of £47,000 was allocated to 43 projects voted for across four "U Decide" carried out in 2009/10. 93% of people said that they would attend future events. The allocated amount to "U Decide" events represents only a fraction of the overall Cash grants' budget with a significantly high return on residents' satisfaction.
- 5.4 The "U Decide" events proved to be a successful tool in reaching new groups. In some wards, a number of new groups were identified who had not previously submitted Cash grants or been involved in council activity. In one ward, 27% of people said that they had not attended any other council event in the last six months.
- 5.5 In 2010 / 11 a further two pilots have been carried out in Chorlton and Fallowfield using Cash and a further three events are planned in Northenden, Abbey Hey (using funding from central government) and Whalley Range.

6. Key findings from the Cash grants programme: 2007-2010

6.1 The Cash grants programme continues to provide the means by which local residents can access funding to help them contribute directly to the improvement and regeneration of their own neighbourhoods. The provision of funding direct to local groups, thereby enabling them to undertake projects that they themselves identified as priorities, has had a significant impact on the level of ownership demonstrated by residents to the projects in their areas. This has meant that the sustainability of projects has been increased, with residents continuing to maintain, or applying for funding in subsequent years, to improve or develop previously funded schemes.

Appendix 1 (attached) shows the breakdown of Cash allocation by ward over a three year period since 2007/08. It shows what money has been allocated, to which groups' year on year.

There has been a steady increase in the number and value of Cash grant applications over the years, with many wards having more applications than they can fund. Most wards have seen an increase in the number of successful projects (in money terms). Only Miles Platting and Newton Heath have seen an average decrease of 9.8% over a two year period in the number of successful applications. The City Centre has seen proportionally the highest change/rise in successful Cash Grants from £28, 701 in 2007/08 to £39, 987 in 2009/10, which represents nearly a 40% increase. As other funding streams become more, scarce it is anticipated that the demand for Cash grants will increase. For example, this year we have seen an increase in the number of alleygating schemes requesting funding through Cash grants

6.2 The initial experience gained during the first years of the programme, which saw many small scale developments such as hanging baskets and landscaping/environmental schemes, enabled local groups and residents grow in confidence and ability to move towards bigger projects. The Cash's schemes are supporting now larger, more complex and ambitious projects put forward and delivered by local residents and community groups. The bottom up approach to this grants' programme has led to the development of locally sourced ideas and solutions, which are cost effective and relevant to the local needs. Over the last three years, Cash has helped to grow the local talent and capacity at the grass root level amongst many deprived and diverse communities. Cash funded schemes attract people of all walks of life who give their time to help others, to learn new skills and enjoy the neighbourhoods they live in. They do this by improving and celebrating their areas as well as by raising awareness of different cultures that can be found in our city. The last three examples showcase the very nature of this scheme, which for some residents became the way of life. .

CASE STUDY – GORTON 100 COMMITTEE

Gorton 100 was a community led project which celebrated 100 years since Gorton joined the Manchester District. The project was a result of a conversation between some active members of the Gorton community who wanted to recognise 100 years of Gorton history as well as celebrate Gorton's present day. Gorton 100 was a massive success and exceeded the expectations of the community, the committee and the officers involved in the project. What started out as a small desire to recreate the rush cart one last time and to hold a candle lit procession at the end of the year turned into a series of projects such as lantern parade and fire display in Gorton Park.

CASE STUDY - CHURNETT STREET RESIDENTS, HARPURHEY

The group applied for a Cash grant to build a raised garden at a sheltered accommodation for older people to encourage those who cannot do any gardening because of old age, disability or ill health to get involved and to provide gentle exercise along with creating a sense of community. The project has achieved a sense of community, as it was so successful in encouraging more residents to get involved in gardening that it actually resulted in the residents winning prizes at the RHS North West In Bloom awards in 2009 and 2010.

CASE STUDY - VARIOUS SCHOOLS, CITY-WIDE

A number of primary schools took part in an innovative 7-week project as part of Manchester Schools African History. The objective of the project was to raise awareness of different cultures and raise the aspirations of young people whilst creating fun and meaningful learning, through a variety of ways such as poetry, music, painting and mask making. This partnership project matched young people, elderly people and artists working together with local parents from a range of cultures, celebrating diversity.

7. Conclusion

7.1 Since the launch of the Cash grant programme, the Council has made significant capital and revenue investment to 32 wards in Manchester. This investment led to improvements to the environment, social capital and local infrastructure of these wards. Over the years, we have learnt lessons, changed the way we deliver and administer the programme so that we are more effective and accountable to local communities. The Cash grant programme supports many community activities, which directly contribute to the corporate values, and strategies championed by the City Council and make Manchester a better place to live. Recently, the Cash grant programme helped to facilitate a series of "U Decide" events to engage local residents in influencing decision around budgets. The scale of participation at the "U Decide" events suggest that there is a real appetite amongst residents and community groups to be involved and reconnected with democratic processes.
